BREAKFAST CLUB AND AFTER SCHOOL CLUB

Please can we remind you about our Breakfast and After School clubs. Breakfast club starts at 7.45am in the morning and runs until the start of the school day. The cost with breakfast is £3 per child, or £2 without. The Penpol Pirates After School Club runs every day, up until 6pm if required.

HARVEST ASSEMBLY

This year, our Harvest assembly will be on Tuesday 10th October. This year we have decided once again to have an in house assembly for the children, their teachers and helpers in school. (It is

We would still like to involve the local community and so donations of harvest gifts would be much appreciated. However, this year we have a slightly different plan for delivering the harvest parcels.

For the past few years, our Penpol Friends members have kindly tried delivering the harvest produce to the names and addresses that parents provide on the nomination slips. However, this is proving to be increasingly difficult - sometimes people are out or, on occasions, elderly people understandably not wanting to open their door to strangers. So this year, on the slips, we are asking for the names and classes of children making the nominations. The harvest gift will then be taken to class for the children to take home and deliver with their parents later in the day.

PENPOL SCHOOL PHOTOGRAPHS

This year our school photographs are being taken on Wednesday 11th October. If you have younger children at home that you would like to be photographed with your children who are already at Penpol School, please come in at 8.15am on this morning. To assist with the smooth running of this first session, please collect a numbered ticket from the



office. We would also request that your children are kept with you in the hall at this time and not left to wander around the school. Following the family groups, the school will then organise brothers and sisters within the classes to be photographed together throughout the morning, and finally, individuals. Whilst you are in no way obliged to purchase any photographs we find it much easier to organise the sitting of photographs in this way, (i.e., it is much easier to take photographs of everyone and not to single some out).

FLU IMMUNISATION DAY - MONDAY 27TH NOVEMBER

The nurses from Kernow Health will be visiting school on Monday 27th November to administer the flu vaccines. This year, children in the Reception classes, Year 1, Year 2, Year 3 and Year 4 will be entitled to receive the vaccine. (Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10). After half-term, we will be sending home a letter from the Kernow Health team with an information leaflet and a consent form. ALL CONSENT FORMS NEED TO BE COMPLETED AND RETURNED TO SCHOOL, EVEN IF YOU DO NOT WISH YOUR CHILD TO RECEIVE THE VACCINE. The vaccination is free and recommended for children and will be given by a quick and simple spray up the nose. For further information please see www.nhs.uk/child-flu.

ROUTINE WEIGHING & MEASURING FOR RECEPTION AND YEAR 6 PUPILS

OPERATION ENCOMPASS

Operation Encompass launched in Cornwall on the 19th September, with the aim to support children that are exposed to domestic abuse. The police and educational settings, such as Penpol, have partnered up to provide support, with the use of early intervention and safeguarding. Children who witness violence and traumatic events may arrive at school the next day without anyone being aware of what has happened. These types of situations can cause changes to their behaviour, which can in turn negatively affect their academic progress and their social and emotional wellbeing. Operation Encompass works by reporting these incidents to the child's school at the start of the next day (prior to 9am). This information is then passed to a key adult within the school, who can then put in place the support needed for the child. Please see further information on our website.
