PLAY AND LEARN

BREAKFAST CLUB AND AFTER SCHOOL CLUB

Please can we remind you about our Breakfast and After School clubs. Breakfast club starts at 7.45am in the morning and runs until the start of the school day. The cost with breakfast is £3 per child, or £2 without – no need to book, just come to the school hall. The Penpol Pirates club runs every day, up until 6pm if required. There are differing charges depending on how long your child stays. To guarantee a place, you will need to book in advance, please try not to leave it until the last minute.

'ASPENS SELECT' SCHOOL DINNERS




Many thanks for your support with our new school dinner arrangements. If you have still not registered with Aspens please could we encourage you to do so. Even if your child only has one school dinner a year, it would be beneficial to get this process completed now. Could we remind you that if you have pre-ordered your child's meals but then they are absent from school, please go on to your Aspens account and cancel

the meal for that day as otherwise you may still be charged.

We have also noticed that when some children go to collect their lunch, they do not know what their parents have ordered for them! Please can you make sure your child is aware each day of what they are having. We know there have been a few teething problems for some parents, but we are working with Aspens to get these issues resolved as soon as possible, so many thanks for your patience. We are confident that this new method of ordering and paying for school dinners will reduce food wastage in our school kitchen and be more convenient for parents.

MEDICINE

If your child needs medicine while they are at school, we are happy to administer it. Please come into reception and leave the medicine with us (never leave it with your child in their school bag) and sign our permission book. However please could we ask wherever possible, that this is just once a day, preferably at lunchtimes. We understand that sometimes antibiotics need to be given four times a day, but please try to work out a routine whereby you give the other three doses at home, for example, at breakfast time, teatime and bedtime. Thank you for your understanding with this.

ORDERING SCHOOL UNIFORM VIA PARENTPAY

Many thanks to all those parents who have been using the ParentPay system to order school uniform. Sadly, we are not as efficient as Amazon Prime, so it will take us a day or two to get your order prepared if we have the items in stock! However, with over 400 children now at Penpol, there will be occasions where some items may not be available immediately. In future, we will send a text when your uniform order is ready to collect.

PENPOL SCHOOL PHOTOGRAPHS

Our school photographs will be taken on Tuesday 8th October. If you have younger children at home that you would like photographed with your children who are already at Penpol School, please come to the hall from 8.15am on this morning. We would request that your children are kept with you in the hall at this time and not left to wander around the school. Following these family groups, the school will then organise brothers and sisters within the



classes to be photographed together throughout the morning, and finally, individuals. Whilst you are in no way obliged to purchase any photographs we find it much easier to organise the sitting of photographs in this way, it is much easier to take photographs of everyone and not to single some out).

APPLYING FOR A RECEPTION OR SECONDARY SCHOOL PLACE FOR SEPTEMBER 2020

The on-line application forms are now open for children requiring a Reception class place for September 2020 and the current Year 6 children who will be transferring to secondary school next year. It is **so very important** to apply for these places before the deadlines. VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS/SCHOOL TRIPS

We regularly organise school trips for the children as we strongly believe they enhance and reinforce the lessons taught in the classrooms. PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING

It is important that all families who would be entitled to Free School Meals apply for Pupil Premium Funding. (If you have already done this, thank you so much and no further action is necessary). All Infants are entitled to have a free meal every day, but if any family (Junior or Infant) are on a low income and would have been entitled to free school meals anyway, it is so very important for you to apply. The process is very straightforward and totally confidential. If you log on to the Cornwall Council website and choose 'Schools' and then 'School Meals' you can type in your details and find out immediately if you are eligible for this funding. If you are not sure how to do this, please call in and see us at the office and we will be able to help you.

It is so important to our school that everyone who is eligible applies — the money is there to be granted, but if you do not apply, the school does not receive these extra funds. We also receive extra funding for children if either of the parents are in the forces — if you think this applies to you and we don't know about it, please come in and let us know at the office.

COATS FOR PLAYTIMES

It is really beneficial for the children to be able to go outside at playtimes to let off some steam, so with the cooler, rainier days now fast approaching, please could you make sure your child brings a coat to school with them every day. Thank you.
